Coming off of a 2021 Copa America, and a 2022 FIFA World Cup title, Argentina look to continue their success at the 2024 Copa America in the US. Being one of the pioneer teams in the CONMEBOL Copa America, participating in the first ever edition in 1916. Tied with Uruguay for the most wins at the Copa America with 15, and being the reigning champs they have a big target on their back. This may be the last major tournament with this generational talent, e.g. Lionel Messi, Angel Di Maria, and coach Lionel Scaloni.
