COPA AMERICA 2024 - USA

Colombia hopes to continue their recent success at the 2024 CONMEBOL Copa America in the US. After a recent 5-1 victory over the USMNT they extended their unbeaten streak to 21 games and are hoping to build on that confidence this summer. Their first appearance at the Copa America was in 1945 since then they have made 23 appearances at the Copa America. Their best result came in 2001 when they won the whole tournament beating Mexico 1-0 to lift the trophy.
