West Germany won the UEFA European Champions in 1972 and 1980, while the reunified Germany triumphed at EURO '96 in England. While West Germany did not participate in the first two editions and did not qualify for the 1986 edition, they have not missed the tournament since. Germany look to put the World Cup behind them and make their fans proud on home soil.
